The Churchill Northern Studies Centre (CNSC) is an independent, non-profit research and education facility, located 23 km outside of Churchill, MB.

The CNSC facilitates scientific research and programming on the natural sciences and the environment in pursuit of its mission to understand and sustain the north.

Lunch in CNCS cafeteria (12pm-2pm)

Green Building Tour (1 hour)

\$89 flat rate, \$10/person after 5 pax

Enjoy a compelling journey through the CNSC's environmentally friendly 27,000 sq. ft. LEED-certified research station. Available all year round.

Rocket Range Tour (1 hour)

\$362 flat rate, \$20/person after 5 pax

Take a guided tour of the Churchill Rocket Range National Historic Site – built in 1954 – and learn about its ties to the Canadian Space Agency and NASA. Available all year round.

Ecology Walk (1 hour)

\$352 flat rate, \$15/person after 5 pax

Enjoy a guided walk around the CNSC property with our research staff to learn about several of our current research study sites, and why it's important to conduct research in the subarctic. Available in summer months.

Current Research Talk (1 hour)

\$184 flat rate, \$10/person after 5 pax

Learn about the local ecology where three distinct eco-zones intersect and what makes the CNSC an optimal location for a research station. This dynamic presentation also includes an overview of some of the research projects currently being pursued at the Centre to help connect you to the critical subarctic science we support. Available all year round.

Subarctic Outdoor Adventure (1 hour)

\$460 base rate, \$44/person after 10 pax

Spend your afternoon learning about snow science and participating in outdoor activities, such as igloo and inukshuit building. Available in the winter months



Ramsay Trail Hike (2 hours)

\$462 base rate, \$20/person after 5 pax

Take a guided tour around Ramsay Lake trail to observe and understand the various species of flora and fauna in our unique environment, while passing by remaining rockets and materials from the neighbouring historic Rocket Research Range. Available in the summer months

Tidal Flats Walk (2 hours)

\$590 base rate, \$30/person after 7 pax

Head to Bird Cove for an interpretive low tide walk and the chance to see local birds. Available in the summer months.
